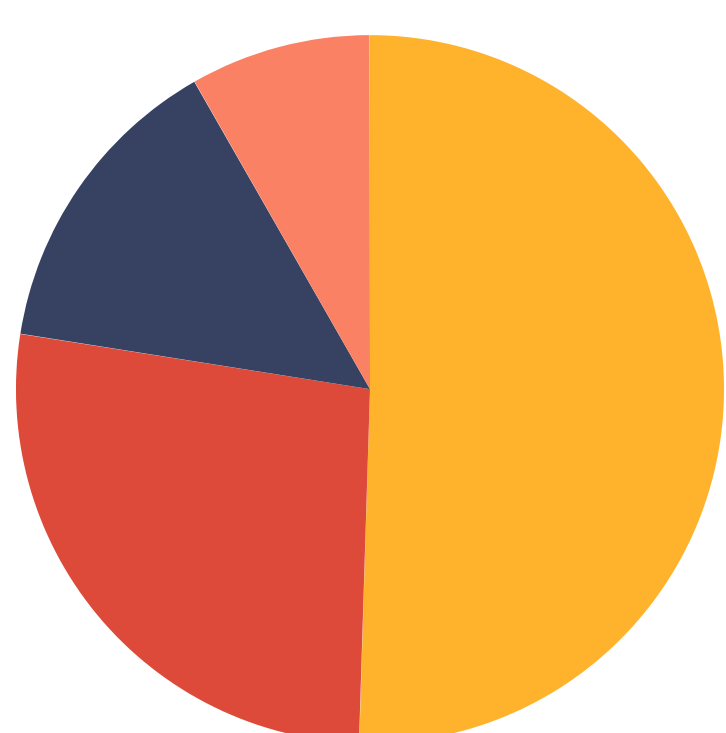


IMPACT of Child Care Development Block Grant Reauthorization of 2014 & 2018 Increase in Funding

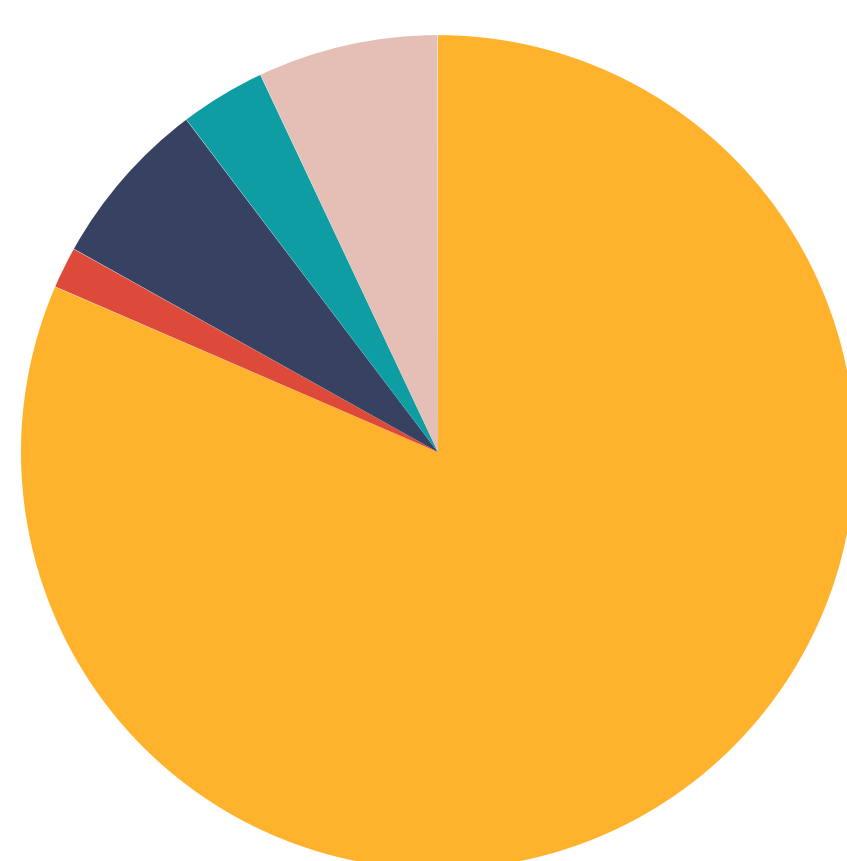

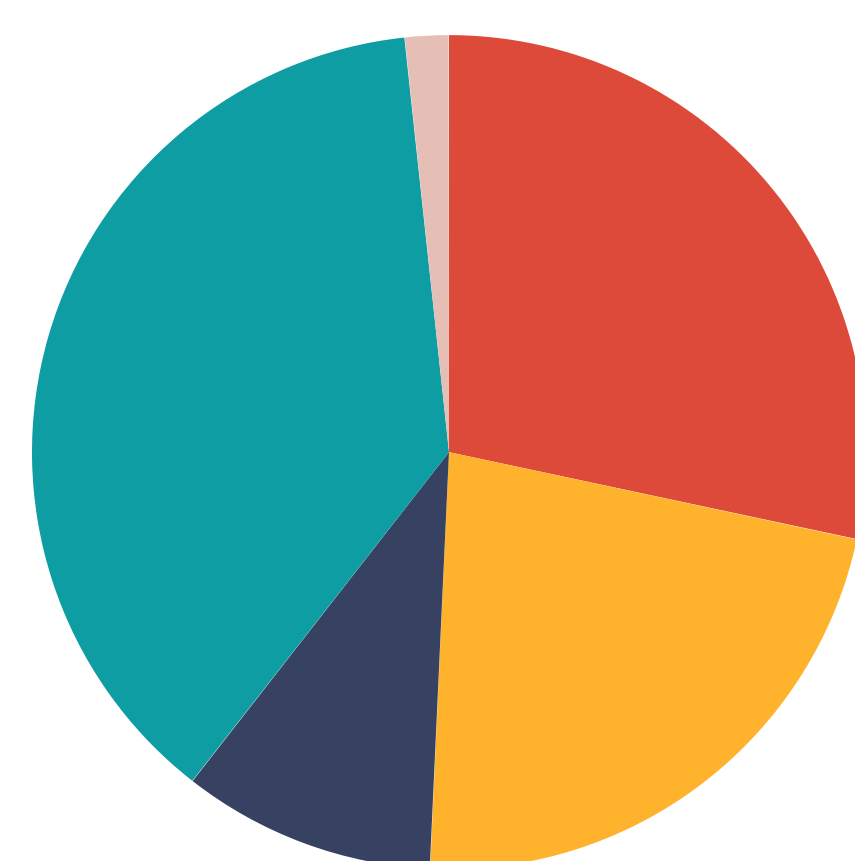

Oklahoma received an additional

\$55 million

in Child Care Development Funds

\$13.8 million

per month paid to providers supporting local Oklahoma economies.

- ✓ 49,950 Oklahoma children utilized child care assistance in 2019, a 13% increase.
- ✓ First to create a Quality Rating & Improvement System (QRIS) in 1998. 96% of child care payments are paid to a 2 or 3 Star facility.

- ✓ Copayments are capped at 7% of a family's income, decreasing copays for most families. Family of four grossing \$60K/year is eligible for assistance.
- ✓ Rates for infants and toddlers in a 2 Star program are 65% of the market rate.

Over 12 million children under the age of five are in some type of child care..

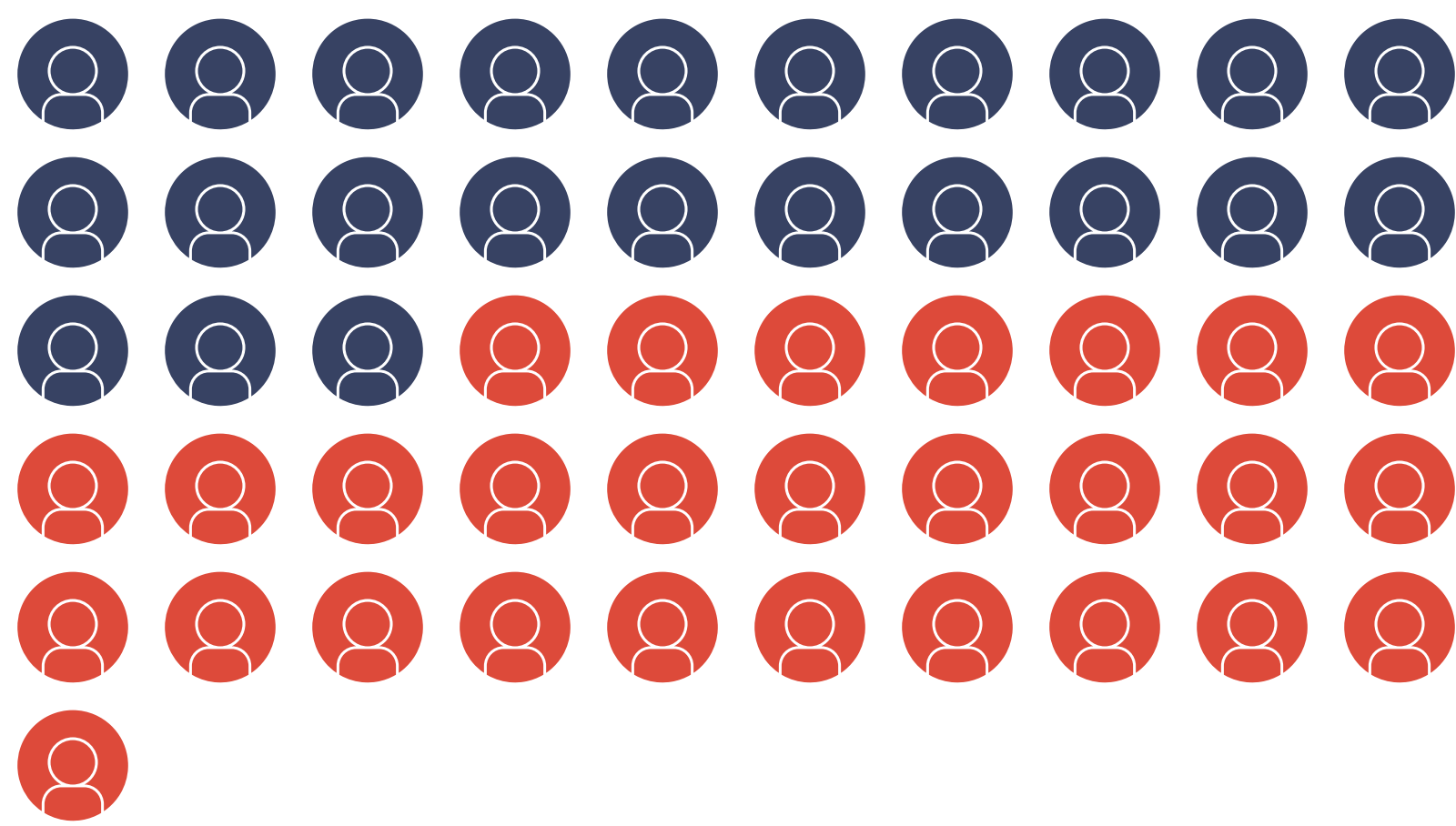

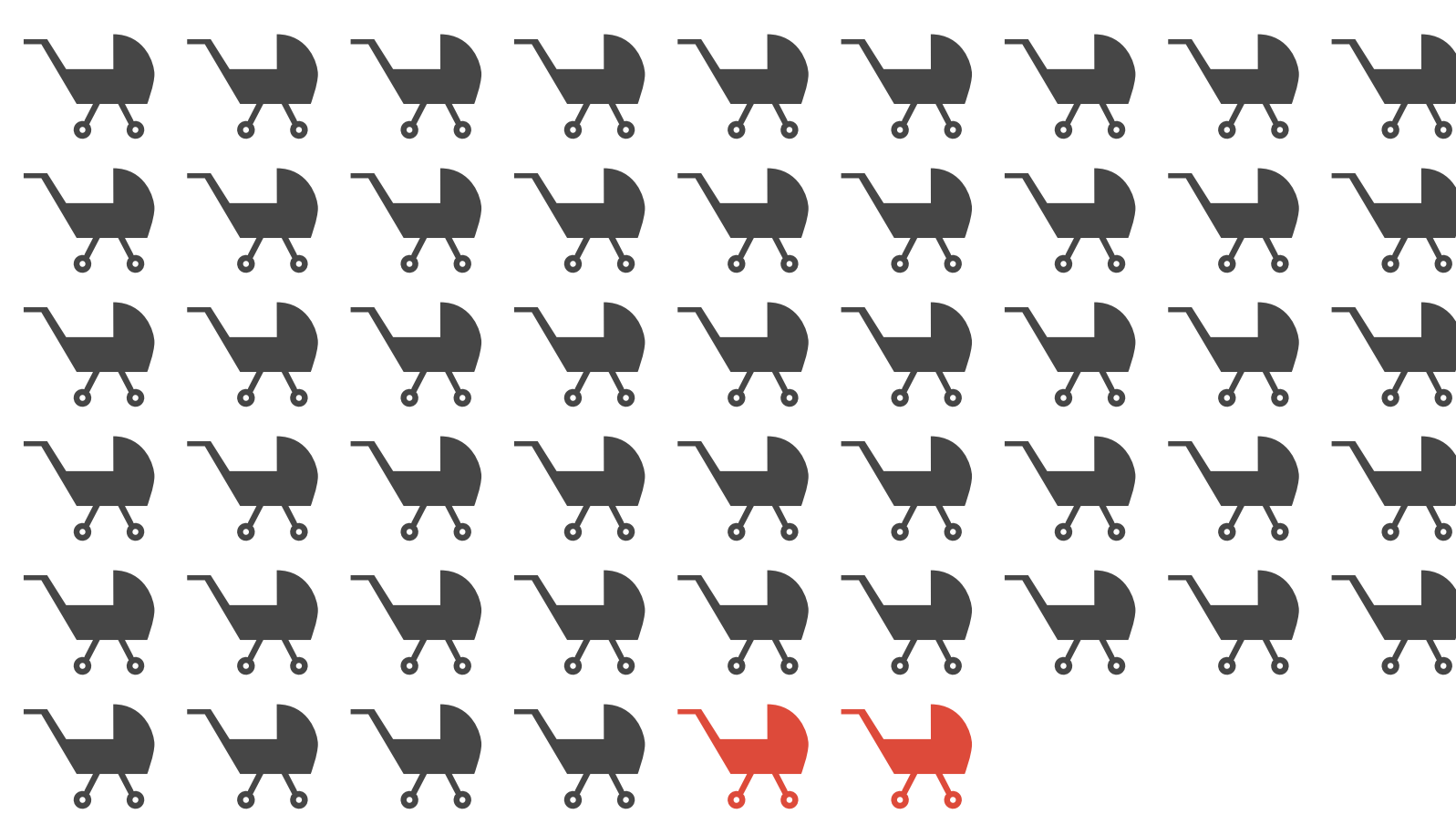
How States Are Spending Additional Funds

Working On (96.08%) Not Working On (3.92%)

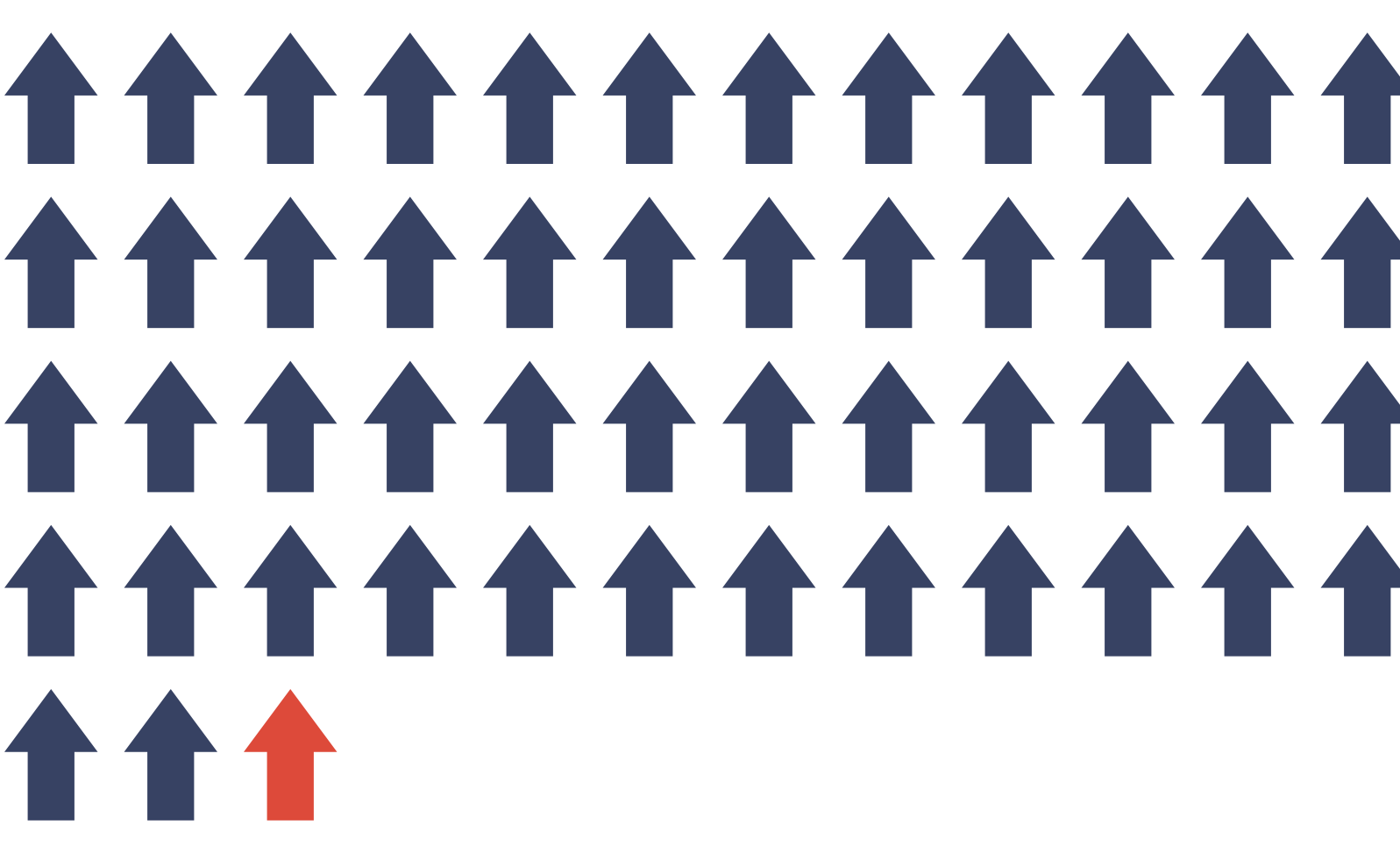
Congress appropriated \$5.2 billion to support state child care systems in 2018 and 2019.
